Record Book Do's and Don'ts

As we approach the Fair the farthest thing from our minds is record books, but that should be the first thing you think about.

As we are busy cooking, sewing, cutting and pasting that craft project, and washing the pigs, take pictures. Action pictures of you doing the work are wonderful for your record book. Pictures in the show ring are nice, but most judges want to see you doing the hard part.

I hope everyone has kept track of the hours spent working on those projects. An important part of your records is knowing how much time you spent in the kitchen or in the pen feeding. Remember 4-H records don't have to be hard. If I can be of help to you as you fill out your records, please give us a call.

SPEAKING OF RECORD BOOKS

Kansas 4-H is updating the record book process. Wildcat District has been chosen as a pilot for the new process. This is a good opportunity for us to provide feedback to the state 4-H office and achieve uniform standards for our youth across the district. The new record book process will be completed using form-fillable PDFs. Save the PDF to your computer before starting to complete it. Each county's 4-H council will determine how awards and pins work for their county. In the future there will be an option to complete record books online through the app Zsuite. ****Please delete any old record forms saved on your computers****

1. Determine which projects you will fill a record book out for: **Please review the complete Record Book Project List in order to fill out the proper record book, found on our website.** (example: youth in the forestry project should complete a record book on Plant Science or youth in canning should title their record book foods & nutrition. See the list above for the correct categories)
2. Create a notebook (4-H record book folder or three ring binder) for EACH project record book. Record books should be separated by project area (ie. folder for Beef, folder for clothing, etc.) Each books should have all the pages, offices can help make copies of current year's personal page and current year's permanent record. Separating the books into different folders allows for quicker and easier judging. Tabs for sorting the book are appreciated but please don't use page protectors.
3. Select your age division to fill out the proper paperwork to complete your record book! The pilot record books are broken into three age divisions based on 4-H age. Youth may compete in high age divisions but not lower. Youth must fill out the paperwork for the age division they wish to compete in.
4. Submit to your club leader by their deadline for signatures and sorting. Your club leader will submit to the office by the October 1st deadline.

Members will fill our record books for each project area they wish to be considered for awards. Each book will be turned in with a separate folder to include the following; A personal page, permanent records, story, record sheet with photos. Seniors will NOT do KAPS this year.

You need to be in the building 20 minutes before your scheduled judging consultation. Be sure to check in at the door and pick up your exhibit cards. The schedule will sometimes run ahead.

Ribbon placings may be dropped at the judges discretion due to lateness. Judges will not be asked to stay over 15 minutes past their last scheduled consultation of the day.

Schedules will be worked around if possible in the event on a conflict. If you are entered in more that 5 classes per level, remember you can only bring 5 exhibits, one per class.

If you are unable to attend the conference judging, but can have your food there, it can still be judged. **You may have someone else bring your food for judging, but no one can accompany your exhibit to be judged.** Please make any notes you want the judge to know about your food and attach it to your exhibit. 4-H Foods Judging will only take place on the 24th.

Each club will have a table to display their members food items. Each member that has a non-perishable food item should display at least one item on the table. All perishable items and other non-perishables will need a picture and a recipe to be compiled in a notebook on the table as a collection. Tables may be decorated and they will be judged by people's choice

The schedule will sometimes run ahead. **Ribbon placings may be dropped at the judge's discretion due to lateness. Judges will not be asked to stay over 15 minutes past their last scheduled judging consultation for the day.** Please note: Schedules will be worked around in case of a conflict – if you see a conflict, please let us know as soon as possible.

The Public Revue will be held Friday evening, July 21st at the FNB 4-H Learning Center at 7:30 p.m. This will also be during Relay for Life. Please be at the here by 7:15 dressed and ready to go. **You may model up to TWO outfits, please let Cheri know which ones you want to model.**

The public style revue is part of the Fair and is mandatory to receive ribbons and premium money. Absences may be excused by Cheri. **Displaying your garments at the Fair is also mandatory.**

When you arrive on Friday morning you will need to check in at the information table in the fellowship hall or the hallway. Number of items to be judged for construction are in (). If this is not correct contact the Extension Office.

Please plan to be early as we may be running ahead of schedule. If the schedule does not give you enough time to change (BE CALM) we will go on to the next person and work you in when we can or wait for you.

Please do not leave after you have styled until the judge has selected call backs for choosing Grand & Reserve Champions.

Narrations need to be into the office by Tuesday, July 18th. Minor changes may be made to the narrations the day of judging by telling the judges helper.
